

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
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Agenda



This program is a series of 4 workshops covering everything from where ideas come from, to choosing the right words, character building, the parts of a story, and how to put it all together into a creative writing piece of your own.

8:00- 8:30 Registration

8:30—8:45 Introductions and Welcome

8:45— 9:45 *Workshop 1 - The Idea Jar*

During this 1 hour workshop we will learn what a good idea for creative writing is, where to find them, how to develop them. Loads of examples for mining ideas will be given that can be used both in the classroom or at home.

9:45 - 10:00 Morning Break

10:00—11:30 *Workshop 2 - Wordplay*

Choosing the right word can make or break a sentence. How do we pick the right ones? How can we help fledgling writers learn these skills. This 1 hour workshop will bring wordplay out of our heads and into the classroom. We'll run through some fun games and exercises that will help simplify this sometimes difficult task.

11:30—12:30 Lunch - Opportunity to ask questions with Adam about the morning sessions.

12:30—1:30 *Workshop 3 - This is a Good Story*

We have story ideas. We've figured out how to pick the best words. Now we get to combine it all into a good story. This 1 hour workshop will guide us through the process of turning our ideas into a creative writing masterpiece. With lots of examples and some fun creative play, we'll learn how to put all our ingredients together to create something new.

1:45—2:30 *Workshop 4 - Walk a Mile in My Shoes*

In our final workshop of the day, we will get hands on with some of the exercises and games that we've discussed throughout the day, giving us the opportunity to experience these creative lessons just as our students would. This interactive and entertaining workshop will offer educators new skills, ideas, concepts and exercises that they can implement in the classroom and get their students excited about writing. Adam will also be happy to conduct a Q&A at the end.
